



Parent / Student-Athlete Contract

When you registered your student-athletes you digitally signed agreement to the following contract, which identifies parent and student-athlete "code of conduct" and "financial responsibility."

You must also provide two copies of:

- Current AAU card needs to be purchased under the Strictly Hoops Club Code TF598D
- Birth certificate (do not need to provide if you played for Strictly Hoops in 2011)

Parent Code of Conduct:

1. I will respect the coaching staff and their decisions, understanding this is competitive basketball.
2. I will not enter the court during a game, scrimmage or practice unless otherwise asked to do so by the coach.
3. I will not verbally or physically abuse, confront, taunt, harass or demean a coach, student-athlete, opposing student-athlete or coach, or referee at any time.
4. If I have questions regarding playing time or playing position, I understand there must be a 24-hour cooling off period before talking to the coach or Strictly Hoops Directors.
5. I understand parents cannot coach their child or other student-athletes from the sideline or anywhere else during scrimmages, practices, or games.
6. I will follow the "chain of command" to lodge a complaint.
 - a. Players in grades 8-12 should initiate contact with their coach regarding playing time.
 - b. If the player-coach meeting doesn't solve the issue, a meeting will be scheduled with the parents, player, coach or Strictly Hoops Directors.
 - c. All other issues (other than playing time) should be communicated to the coach or Strictly Hoops Directors by the parents.
7. I will not conspire with other parents to undermine the authority of any coach, the program or the club.
8. I will make every effort to allow my child to attend all practices, games, tournaments, and team functions.



Student-Athlete Code of Conduct:

1. I will abide by all AAU rules and regulations.
2. I will abide by all team rules, including good attendance, respect for teammates and adults, and maintain a positive attitude.
3. Any requests to play for competing, outside teams, or clubs other than Strictly Hoops shall be forwarded to Strictly Hoops Directors and Advisory Board for review. Decisions will be on a case-by-case basis, weighing factors unique to each particular request.

Parent Financial Responsibility:

1. I understand that if I voluntarily decide to no longer participate in Strictly Hoops after my student-athlete has been placed on a team, there will be no refund and I am obligated to pay any remaining balance due.
2. I am obligated to pay either the full amount of \$600.00 upon team acceptance OR monthly fees of \$230 per month based on my child's team, paid in full by the 5th of each month (except March which is due upon team acceptance).

[Napa teams only: I am obligated to pay either the full amount of \$525.00 upon team acceptance OR monthly fees of \$200 per month based on my child's team, paid in full by the 5th of each month (except March which is due upon team acceptance).]
3. I understand payments made after the 5th of the month will be considered past due and will be subject to a \$15 late charge.
4. I agree to pay a \$75 non-refundable administrative fee at registration. In the rare occurrence Strictly Hoops cannot place a student-athlete on a team the registration fee will be refunded.
5. If new to the club, I agree to purchase a Strictly Hoops uniforms for \$80.00.
6. Players playing into June-July are responsible for an equal portion of the travel expenses for Coaches. An estimated amount will be collected in June and receipts will be presented at the end of July to either collect further or refund any overage.
7. I understand any student-athlete whose account is **past due** for more than **15 days** will be removed from their team and will not be allowed to participate in practices or games. I understand the student-athlete will be ineligible to participate in games or practices until her account is brought into good standing.
8. If parent or student-athlete fails to complete any obligation or violates the Code of Conduct, may prevent the child from participating in upcoming games, tournaments, or practices. In more severe and/or repeat instances, the student-athlete and family may be dismissed from Strictly Hoops.
